The U.S. Congress and Colorado Legislature, the Colorado Dept. of Public Health and Environment, allied organizations such as the Colorado Search and Rescue Board, Colorado State Fire Chiefs and the American College of Emergency Physicians have all heard from EMSAC on many occasions.



The EMS Chiefs, Managers & Directors Section concentrates on topics of importance to managing EMS agencies and the people that do so. This is done by working with the Division of Insurance to close payment loopholes, working to improve management training and representing EMS on State committees and task forces: EMS Safety, Air Ambulance Licensing, EMS Data Task Force, All Hazards Preparedness, Community Paramedicine and Medicaid rate Review.
